The Luxembourg Empire: A Forgotten Bridge of Civilizations





My Recipe:

- Step 1 Prepare your espresso. Mix together 2 or 3 teaspoons of Mount Hagens instant coffee ground in a mug with 2 tablespoons of warm water. Give it time to cool off to room temperature (or stick it in the fridge to speed up the process).
- Step 2 Shake and strain the cocktail. Place the espresso, vodka, coffee liqueur, simple syrup, and ice in a cocktail shaker. Shake until frosty, then strain into a martini glass.
- Step 3 Choose your garnish. To be extra garnish the top by sprinkling coco powder or cinnamon sugar onto the surface or decoratively place a few coffee beans in the center of the drink.

- Brew the Espresso:
 - Brew 1 oz of fresh espresso. Let it cool for a few minut (you can even refrigerate it to speed up the process).
- · Prepare the Glass:
 - Chill your martini glass by placing it in the freezer of filling it with ice water for a few minutes.
- Mix the Drink:
 - In a cocktail shaker, add
 - 1 oz cooled espresso
 - 1 oz vodk
 - 1 oz coffee lique
 - Fill the shaker with ice cult
- Shake
 - Shake vigorously for about 15 seconds to ensure the ingredients are well mixed and chilled.
- Strain:
- Remove the ice from your martini glass, then strain the mixture from the shaker into the glass using a fine mesh

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
